Submissions Guidelines

Burning Daylight accepts submissions from November 1, 2011 through January 15, 2012. Essays must be original work, not under review for publication elsewhere, by students at the baccalaureate and post-baccalaureate levels. All essay submissions must be sent via email to the editor of *Burning Daylight* at burningdaylight@sonoma.edu. Attach cover letter and essay submission as two separate Microsoft Word documents to submission emails. Please do not have any identifying markers on your essay. Submissions will not be returned.

All cover letters must include the following: author's name, phone number, email address, degree in progress, name of the institution where the degree is being pursued, and the title of the essay.

Essay submission guidelines: 10-12 pages, MLA format, standard 12 point font.

Burning Daylight publishes both electronically and in print. Editions are available annually at the end of May.
