Katie Pierce, Co-Chair, convened the meeting at 12:05 p.m.

**I. Alcohol and Drug Sanctioning Fees**

Michael Daine, Director of the Counseling and Psychological Services department came to speak to the committee about increasing alcohol and drug sanctioning fees. Michael explained that with the current structure of intervention & treatment, there are issues around substance use and abuse. He would like to help shift from a punishment model to an education & support model. He consulted with

Karen Daine, Coordinator of the Alcohol & Drug Education Program, Matthew Lopez-Phillips, Director of Judicial Affairs and Chuck Rhodes, Director of Student Development about Level 1 and Level 2 mandated issues. Level 2 includes a cursory evaluation and then the student is referred to an off-campus agency, Drug Abuse Alternative Center (DAAC) in Santa Rosa. Although a very good agency, they are not able to meet the unique needs of our students of being in a university environment and the stressors related to that. The Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS) department has not really had much of a role in intervention and prevention of substance use and abuse. Under this new proposal, what will change is the level of assessment from CAPS. Students in a Level 2 program will get a whole range of treatment options here on-campus, versus having to go to Santa Rosa to an agency that does not provide treatment for dual-diagnosis patients. An on-going recovery support group will also be available, which students don't get from DAAC. Students will get more treatment and support services for less cost and they won't have to travel to get them. The new fees proposed represent an increase in Level 1 fees from \$40 to \$65 and Level 2 fees from \$60 - \$180. The increase in fees will fund more staff hours. They may also have an unpaid internship for someone who wants experience. This level of treatment and intervention is not just for mandated cases. People will come in on their own for treatment as well.

Greg asked if he could refer students to this program. Michael answered that yes he could. Katie asked if the fee increase was enough. Michael replied that they would like to work in a cost-of-living increase. Katie suggested it could be included in the recommendation. The committee agreed that a more thorough assessment and complete treatment program in one location at a reduced cost to the patient was an improvement to the current substance intervention program.

**Action Taken:**

The FAC **Moved, Second, and Passed** (unanimously) to recommend an increase in Level 1 fees from \$40 to \$65 and an increase in Level 2 fees from \$60 - \$180.

II. **Approval of 4/7/05 Minutes**

It was **Moved, Second, and Passed** (unanimously) to adopt the minutes of April 7, 2005 as presented.

III. **Announcements**

Katie and Sue worked up the IRA funding summary and recommendation to the President and he approved the awards without making any modifications. Award letters will go out next week. There is one meeting left for this year. If the committee has business, the meeting will take place and if not, the meeting will be cancelled.

Cheryl asked if there are term limits on this committee. Katie answered that there are no term limits. The President appoints the staff, the Senate appoints the faculty, and the Associated Students appoint the student representatives. Jason Spencer, Chris Fadeff and Annette Powell are all graduating this Spring so the committee will be getting new members in their place next year. Nadir Vissanjy will be the new AS President, so he will return to serve on the committee next year.
