**EDCT 552: Educational Technology Praxis**

Educational Technology Praxis is a practical course that requires participants to integrate existing skills and knowledge of information technology into instructional practice. Students will demonstrate proficiency by developing a portfolio of educational resources that are enhanced by the utilization of technology. (This course is the foundation course for the Educational Technology area of emphasis for the Master of Arts in Curriculum, Teaching, and Learning.) Classes will be conducted face-to-face and online.

**EDCT 556: Technology, Pedagogy and Society**

This course considers technology in the context of educational philosophies. It also considers the interaction between technology and American society and culture. It approaches technology with a questioning attitude or state of mind. As such, it is not primarily focused on *how* to employ technology so much as *why* and the impact (positive and negative) of technology on our society, our schools, and us. Classes will be conducted face-to-face and online.
