

Elementary Teacher Preparation Programs at Sonoma State University

This information sheet is for Sonoma State University undergraduate students who wish to become elementary school teachers. In California, elementary teachers teach across the entire curriculum and receive a Multiple Subject Credential.

What major should you choose if you want to be an Elementary School teacher?

At Sonoma State University, we recommend two options for becoming an elementary school teacher. They are:

Integrated or Blended Programs

When completing this option, candidates will receive:

- Subject Matter Preparation
- Bachelor's degree
- CSET: Multiple Subjects exam preparation
- Multiple Subject Credential

Apply to the Credential Program during Sophomore year.

The Credential Program **begins midway through the B.A. program** and candidate receives a, b, c and d simultaneously.

OR

Subject Matter Preparation Programs

When completing this option, candidates will receive:

- Subject Matter Preparation
- Bachelor's degree
- CSET: Multiple Subjects exam preparation

Apply to the Credential program **and to the University** as a "postbac" student during Senior year.

The Credential Program **begins after the B.A. is completed or nearly completed.**

Why should you choose one of these options?

The State of California requires that anyone pursuing a teaching credential meet "subject matter competence". This means that you must prove to the state that you know the subject area(s) that you will be teaching. When pursuing a Multiple Subject (Elementary) teaching credential, you must meet subject matter competence by taking and passing the CSET: Multiple Subjects exam. Choosing a major with either option mentioned above will provide you with preparation for this required exam and will also give you a strong background in the subjects that are taught in the elementary school.

Which is the better option for you?

Students who choose the **Integrated or Blended** option mentioned above are those who decide early in their high school or undergraduate education that a teaching credential is what they want to pursue. Integrated or Blended programs are rigorous programs that move a candidate through the B.A. degree and teaching credential within 4 to 4 1/2 years.

Students who choose the **Subject Matter Preparation** option mentioned above are those who are seriously considering going into the teaching field. This option focuses on the major and subject matter preparation but does not include any teaching credential coursework. Candidates completing this option will take teaching credential coursework as post baccalaureate students (after the B.A.) and thus obtain their B.A. and teaching credential in 5 years. They may take pre-requisite credential courses as undergraduates for upper division GE credit or as electives.

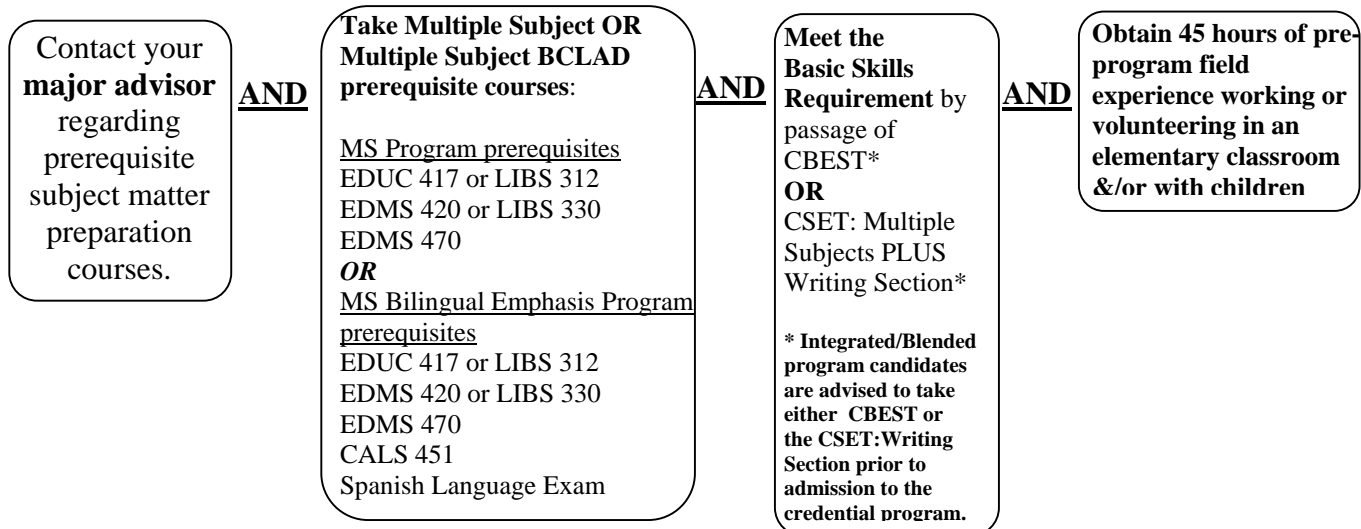

Follow the steps listed here if you are interested in obtaining a Multiple Subject Credential at SSU:

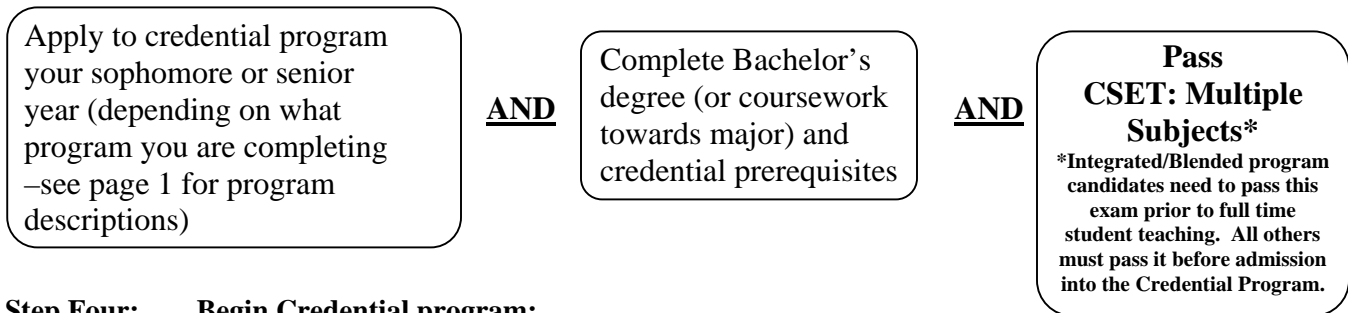
Step One: Choose a credential objective and declare one of the following majors as your subject matter preparation program or integrated/blended program (see above for major advisors).
