Several tips on Registration |

Environmental Microbiology is being offered in Fall 2006. The course number is BIOL 497 and the time is MW - 5:25-6:40 p.m.

Several ENSP classes require “**consent of instructor**” and I will assist you with registering/“permissioning” you for these classes. However, if the course requires you to be an ENSP major, your transcript must read ENSP major. This means you have applied to the department via an application process and have been accepted or as a Freshman or transfer student, you declared your major prior to attending SSU. If this has not occurred, you may have problems during registration. I encourage you to review your transcript and if there is an error, see me.

At your request, if I have “permissioned” you into a class, you must go back through the registration process and add this class to your schedule. In other words, “permissioning” means there is a seat being held

for you, but you must sign up for it. If you are no longer interested in this class, let me know immediately. This permission should hold until Reg. 2 even if your Reg. 1 period has already expired.

Students: Reg. 1 is continuing. If you need to meet with an advisor, faculty office hours are listed in the showcase outside of RCH 18, and signup sheets are posted on faculty office doors. If you experience any difficulty during registration, please call me at 4-2306 and we will try to work out any glitches.
