### Spring 2010 Registration

Use on-line registration during the Nov 30 – Dec. 4<sup>th</sup>, Pass One Registration, with fees due by Jan. 1, 2010.

Pass Two Registration is from Dec. 7 – Dec. 11<sup>th</sup>.

- Once classes begin on February 1, 2010, **all full** LIBS classes will be restricted. This means you will need to GO TO THE FIRST CLASS. Exceptions: 337, 338, 340, 480 LIBS Special Projects – contact professor.
- Once you have secured a seat from the professor, you will need to go on-line and register within 24 hours.
- Remember to pay your fees by Feb 12th or you could lose all your classes.
- If you do **not** show up **on time** for the 1<sup>st</sup> class you are registered for, you will lose your seat if there are students needing the class.
- On-line Open, Add/Drop Registration is Feb. 1 – 12th.
- Go on-line and DROP any classes you don't want asap.

It is **VERY** important for you to register **at the time you are assigned** by Admissions & Records. This time is based on how many units you have completed. The closer you are to graduation, the earlier the registration time you receive. If you do not register then, you lose your advantage and many other students are registering for the courses you may have wanted.
