ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

We are seeking a mature undergraduate or graduate student for an unpaid three-month internship with the Country Analysis Unit (CAU) in the Division of Banking Supervision and Regulation, which is responsible for executing the Federal Reserve System's supervisory activities within the 12th District. CAU focuses on: 1) macro-economic and financial sector developments in Asia and 2) the supervision of Asian foreign banking organizations operating in the United States; the intern will undertake research-oriented tasks in both of these areas. Responsibilities will include country and bank-specific briefings, daily news monitoring, longer-term research projects, and editing, as well as graphical, statistical, and administrative support. The Bloomberg terminal, Federal Reserve library, internet, and various rating agency publications will be utilized on a daily basis. Consideration will be limited to students who can receive course credit from their schools.
