California law requires entering students to provide proof of immunization or immunity to **Measles & Rubella** as well as **Hepatitis B** prior to your first day of classes at SSU as indicated below:

**Measles/Rubella (MMR):** *Required* of students *born after 1956*: Records must show completion of a **series of 2 MMR shots** (or 2 Measles + 1 Rubella shot) given after 12 months of age & at least 1 month apart. If you graduated from a California high school, proof of one MMR shot **after 48 months** of age & **after 1980** is also acceptable.

**Hepatitis B:** *Required* of students who will be **under age 19** when their first semester at SSU begins. Records must show completion of a **series of 3** appropriately spaced **Hepatitis B shots** (minimal sequence is 0, 1 and 4 months). Documented shots need not be repeated, even if the series was not completed within the initial 4-6 month period.

**Records sent must be photocopies of official immunization records** showing type of vaccine, dose, & date of each shot (or copies of blood tests showing appropriate immunity). Records must be **labeled with** your full name, birth date, the name of the doctor or clinic, and signed by the MD/RN. Copies of **official** high school immunization records containing the above information are also acceptable.

**Entering students** who have returned their Intent to Register and paid a deposit or registration fees to SSU **may be immunized at the SSU Student Health Center (SHC)** prior to the start of classes for a nominal fee. (Enrolled students may also receive immunizations and other medical services at the SHC.)

Those unable to complete and submit proof of all required immunizations by two weeks prior to the start of classes must send records of the shots they have completed **plus** a written **request for conditional enrollment**, committing to completing required immunizations within the minimum medically appropriate time sequence.

A **HOLD** will be placed on the registration of students who have not submitted proof of at least one of each type of applicable required immunization by the end of the first week of the student's first semester of classes as well as on the records of those who later fall behind the shortest possible completion sequence.

Students can check their HOLD status by looking up their academic record on Peoplesoft. HOLDS are placed for a variety of compliance reasons throughout the semester. Students should therefore check their Peoplesoft record on a regular basis and resolve HOLDS ASAP.

Exemptions for medical, religious or profound personal belief may be requested, require a signed informed consent, and must be discussed with a Student Health Center nurse/doctor. Medical exemptions require a physician's letter. Exempted individuals may be excluded from campus as a public health measure during a disease outbreak.

**SSU is not responsible for negative outcomes related to exemptions or delays in completing immunizations.**
