Below are some guidelines for your presentation:

#### Milestone #4 - Class Presentation (30 points total)

---

##### Organization of presentation (5 points)

- Powerpoint, webpage, or other electronic format
- intro and background
- methods
- results
- discussion and conclusion

##### Clarity (5 points)

- adequate pace
- enough detail for average GIS user to understand analysis
- precise language
- logical discussion
- crisp conclusion -- a good "take home message"

##### Visual Aids (10 points)

- focus attention on key elements of methods and results
- examples are pictures, maps, graphs, tables
- don't forget a study area map and at least one map with key results of spatial analysis

##### Response to questions (5 points)

- How well responds to audience questions: logic of argument, depth of understanding

##### Participation (5 points)

- Each student must ask at least one question to another presenter at some point in the 3 days of presentations.
- Attendance to all presentations will be noted.
